North Dakota Peace Officers Association Special Operations Committee Dive Team Standards

- 1. Each Dive Team must be affiliated with a law enforcement agency and responding to a request for assistance from a law enforcement agency.
- 2. Each Dive Team must have established Dive Team policy and an established Chain of Command. Policy must be on file with the NDPOA SOC.
- 3. Each dive operation must have a minimum of two additional certified divers for each diver entering the water on the deployment.
- 4. All divers must be certified through a nationally recognized SCUBA diving course. Any course not listed below will be reviewed and approved by the SOC Committee:
 - a. National Association of Underwater Instructors-NAUI
 - b. Professional Association Diving Instructors-PADI
 - c. Scuba Schools International-SSI
 - d. Public Safety Diver-PSD
- 5. Professional development training in acceptable dive rescue skills is vital for each team to be effective and safe. Teams should strive to attend quality advanced training on a biannual basis.
- 6. Each Dive Team must have the capability to deploy outside of their jurisdiction.
- 7. All divers must train in a variety of conditions and must participate in a minimum of four training dives per year with a minimum of one per quarter. Each Dive Team must have documented training in the procedure they are responding to and/or the equipment they are using. (Examples ice diving/body recovery/surface supplied air).
- 8. Dive Teams requesting overtime compensation must be on a paid status with the affiliated law enforcement agency. All reimbursement will be paid directly to the affiliated agency.
- 9. Each Dive Team must submit an annual Dive Team Checklist Form to the Special Operations Committee verifying they meet the above standards prior to applying for reimbursement.
- 10. Each Dive Team must be represented at one SOC Meeting and Training session per calendar year.
