This will acknowledge your letter of March 21, in which you state that recently a prominent attorney of your city raised a question as to whether it was proper for you to issue a marriage license to a war widow, whose husband had been missing and had been reported officially dead by the government after the one year apparently used by the government as a basis for such report. I note from your letter that he wondered how this would compare with the presumptions entitled "Disputable Presumptions," in section 31-1103(26) and also section 31-1104 of the North Dakota Revised Code of 1943.

Chapter 195 of the 1945 Session Laws, I believe, covers the situation mentioned in your letter. Under section 1 of that law, written findings of presumed death, made by the Secretary of War, the Secretary of the Navy, or other officer or employee of the United States authorized to make such findings, pursuant to the federal Missing Persons Act, or a duly certified copy of such finding, shall be received in any court, office, or other place in this state as prima facie evidence of the death of the person therein found to be dead, and the date, circumstances and place of his disappearance. There are other sections in this same chapter, but they are not pertinent to the question raised in your letter.

It seems entirely clear to me that, if you are presented with a certificate from the Secretary of War, or the Secretary of the Navy, or other officer or employee of the United States, authorized to make a finding under the federal Missing Persons Act, that such person is dead, you have to discretion in the matter of issuing a marriage license,. The finding of the proper official is prima facie evidence that the death of such person has taken place and, if you file the record in the office, it would be entirely proper for you, and I believe it would be your duty, to issue a marriage license to the widow of such missing person.
