CITIZEN'S REQUEST FOR OPINION

Karen Jordan requested an opinion from this office under N.D.C.C. § 44-04-21.1 asking whether the City of Mandan, specifically the Fire Chief, violated N.D.C.C. § 44-04-18 by failing to provide a copy of a record.

FACTS PRESENTED

On May 26 and June 26, 2022, Karen Jordan requested that the Mandan Fire Chief Steve Nardello provide a copy of his personal water bill. Chief Nardello did not reply because he never received the emails she sent.²

ISSUE

Whether the City of Mandan Fire Chief violated the open records law by failing to provide a copy of his private water bill.

ANALYSIS

Any attorney general opinion issued under N.D.C.C. § 44-04-21.1, shall be based on the facts given by the public entity. According to the City of Mandan, Chief Nardello never received the emails from Mrs. Jordan.³

Even if Chief Nardello had received the emails requesting his personal water bills, his personal water bill is not a public record for the same reason explained in a recent opinion where Ms. Jordan requested the personal water bill of the Morton County State's Attorney.⁴ As such, Chief Nardello had no duty to produce the requested water bill.
