- o Amy Vorachek (DOCR): Nothing to report
- Mike Lynk (State Radio/DES): State Radio is working through various projects, including projects with ND CJIS.
- o Steve Kelsch (NRG): NRG works closely with sheriff's offices throughout the state.
- Russ Buchholz (DOT): The safety initiative, called Vision Zero, was just announced.
 The DOT has a new "Track a Plow" application, which displays the location of 48 snowplows in the fleet.
- Frank Senn (Chiefs of Police Assoc./Beulah Police Department): Beulah Police
 Department is adjusting to the P1 LERMS to JustWare interface and is in the process
 of updating computers in all its vehicles.
- Shawn Riley (ITD): North Dakota recently became an active opt-in state to FirstNet, which will increase towers and coverage. Shawn Riley met with ND CJIS regarding data sharing.
- Scott Steele (ND Sheriffs & Deputies Assoc.): ND Sheriff's and Deputies Association meets next week in Bismarck at the Quality Inn.
- <u>Dallas Carlson/Molly Goebel (BCI)</u>: BCI continues to work on the criminal history system rewrite, 24/7 system replacement, rap sheet system rewrite, rapid identification device implementation, concealed weapons license system rewrite, and offender registration system enhancements.
- <u>Kara Schmitz-Olson (Cass Co. SA)</u>: Molly Goebel and Meredith Larson presented on the common statute table at the ND State's Attorneys Association, and Meredith Larson sent an email with additional information.
