**RE:** Etab Kiosk Implementation

### PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide guidance regarding the implementation of electronic pull tab (e-tab) credit ticket voucher redemption kiosks in North Dakota. The kiosk trial period was completed successfully and generated positive feedback from participating organizations. The proposed kiosk rules were presented to and approved by the State Gaming Commission. These rules become effective **July 1, 2026** and will appear on our website in the coming weeks. ### EXPECTATIONS

The following expectations apply to Manufacturers, Distributors, and Charitable Gaming Organizations:

- Only kiosks that have been tested and approved by the North Dakota Gaming Division may be installed and operated. Approved kiosk manufacturers currently include Arrow, CGT, Grover, G2, and Powerhouse.
- Any kiosk not previously tested and approved by the Gaming Division must successfully complete a testing phase before it may be placed into operation.
- No additional approval from the Gaming Division is required for the placement of approved kiosks. Beginning July 1, 2026, licensed charitable gaming organizations may utilize approved e-tab kiosks at any licensed gaming site. There is no limit on the number of approved kiosks that may be placed at a licensed site.
- Kiosks may be installed prior to July 1, 2026; however, they may not be activated or used for gaming purposes until on or after July 1, 2026.
- Distributors must continue to maintain records of all kiosks placed in operation, including the manufacturer, serial number, location, and any other pertinent information. Documentation of all kiosks in operation must be available at all times.

- Distributors must continue to provide adequate and complete operational training to charitable gaming organizations before a kiosk is placed into service.
- Charitable gaming organizations must complete the [Gaming Division's online kiosk training](#) prior to operating a kiosk. Proof of completion will be provided to the gaming organization to share with the distributor to verify the training.
- Distributors should verify that charitable gaming organizations have completed the required online training by requesting proof of training completion from the organization to ensure compliance with kiosk regulations.
